## Year 6 Week 3

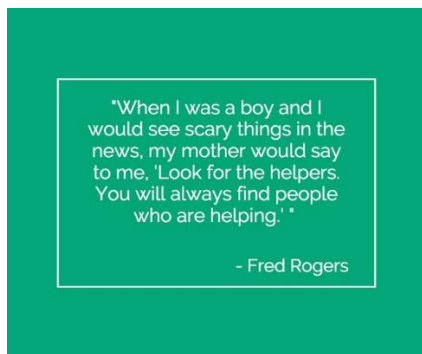
Welcome to our third weekly update, South America Class. Thanks to everyone who has sent through work or submitted it on Purple Mash. It is so nice to see what you are learning at home.

### Maths

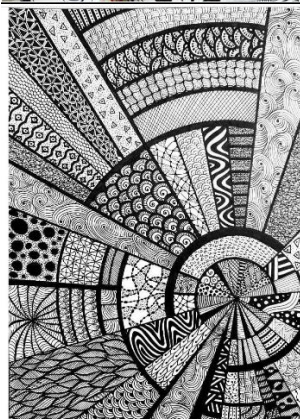
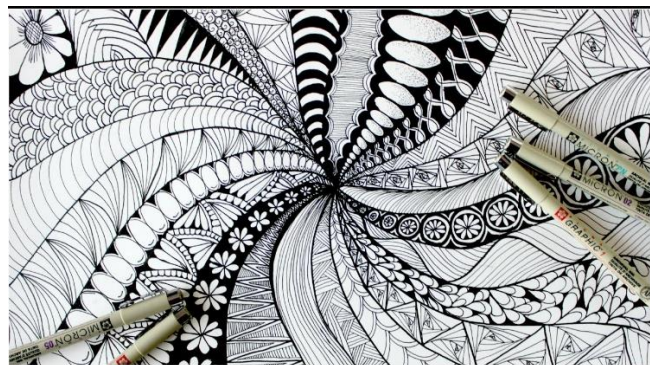
Use the White Rose Maths homelearning page to support you with your Maths learning this week. It is all about angles and gives you a chance to consolidate the work we did on angles in a triangle.
