### Human Geography

Human geography is the study of how people and the environment interact with one another.

### Science – Plant growth and investigations


- Plants need water, light, soil and air to grow.
- If one or more of these are missing, plants may not grow well.
- Plants can grow from seeds or bulbs.
- Plants also need a suitable temperature in order to survive.
- Many mature plants will form buds and flower.
- Observations are a good way to investigate plant growth.
- Investigations are a way of finding answers to questions.
- To work scientifically we need to ask questions.
- We need to observe what is happening to answer the questions.
- When working scientifically we can set up and perform simple tests.
- Once tests have been performed, data can be collected to help answer questions.



### Historical figures

#### Emmeline Pankhurst

- A 'human right' is something a person is entitled to regardless of who they are.
- Equality is where everyone is being treated fairly and given the same opportunities.
- A reform is an action or process to improve a place or the way something is done.
- Emmeline Pankhurst was born in 1858 in Manchester.
- Her family were very wealthy and her parents were both into politics.
- As she grew older, Emmeline noticed that women were treated differently to men.
- She wanted to change how women were treated and what they could do.
- In 1903, she founded the Women's Social and Political Union (WSPU).
- Emmeline Pankhurst is remembered for her hard work with the WSPU in the fight to help get British women the right to vote.



### Vocabulary

**Society** – A group of people living together in a community.

**Equality** – Making sure everyone is treated equally and fairly. Making sure everyone has the same rights and opportunities.

**Reform** – Changing something to make it better.

**Rights** – something that a person is entitled to regardless of who they are.

**Beliefs** – is an idea that a person has which they believe to be true.

**Conflict** – a disagreement or an argument between people or groups of people.

**Growth** – when something develops.

**Investigation** – a way to find out facts and answers to questions.

**Working scientifically** – is the process of asking questions, performing tests, observing, recording data and analysing results.

**Portraits** – A portrait is a representation of a person which is created artistically using paint, photography or sculpture.

**Human Geography** – investigating geographical features on an environment that have been man-made – such as roads, bridges and houses.

**Database** – A computer system which allows you to search, store and record information.

### Art and Design

A portrait is an artistic representation of a person using either paint, photography or sculpture. Portraits were very popular in Victorian England.
